PROJECT OUTPUT DESCRIPTION

In adherence to the school's commitment in the propagation of an extension culture of caring, sharing and empowering, a barangay seminar-workshop was conducted by selected competent faculty members of the School of Languages, Humanities and Social Sciences (SLHS). This time, the extension activity is aligned to a paramount goal shared among developed and developing nations – Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) espoused by the United Nations, which must be cascaded to the local community level – the barangay, in particular.

The seventeen (17) initiatives of SDGs were then interestingly and competently discussed by Prof. Geoffrey Cruz, Prof. Antero Arias, and Dr. Bernardino Ofalia with implications on national and local, governance, project planning and implementation, role and leadership of barangay officials, etc. Key concepts were likewise defined theoretically and operationally. With the speakers' interactive and dynamic presentations, equipped with visuals and statistics, the participants shared their views and insights into the concerns and agenda that matter most to their respective barangays and constituents.

The session then proceeded with the informative lecture of Prof. Neil Edwin Yuzon on barangay planning vis-à-vis SDGs highlighting theoretical and practical constructs, fundamentals, and development-driven principles. At the end of his presentation, a project proposal template was provided that includes project proposals anchored on at least one sustainable development goal, strengths and challenges, and levels of sustainability. He further stressed the need to consider planning based on availability of resources, project feasibility and sustainability.

A workshop conducted by the faculty facilitators followed, with twenty-five (25) barangay officials of Pandacan Manila, and proceeded with the presentations and processing of outputs, and a meaningful exchange of views and perspectives on planning and project proposals. Issues also surfaced along the way but these were properly resolved by the facilitators. Poverty reduction, environmental, education, employment generation were some of the officials' major concerns/interests. In addition, some of the proposals are in fact, projects currently implemented in their respective barangays. A synthesis of the highlights of the workshop was then presented by Prof. Yuzon. However, Prof. Gil Astrophel Orcena argued that proposals and extension service activities must observe a 'project life cycle' principle, and that future extension service activities must also consider mechanisms of implementation, monitoring and evaluation as agenda for discussion.
