Details:

The fourteenth (14th) Community Conference with the theme, "Together! Stronger!" was held last 26 November 2021 through a Zoom Meeting. This is the second online community conference done amidst the pandemic. Although restrictions were already loosen, the Office for Social Orientation and Community Involvement Program (SOCIP) decided to hold the conference online to better safeguard the participants.

The aim of the conference was to showcase the achievement of the partnership between the University and the communities of Pandacan, Manila and to present the future endeavor. In addition, the community conference aimed to align the community development activities to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs). The main speaker of the event was the SOCIP Director, Engr. Joyrence Mervin Q. Agas.

The conference started with the keynote address of the SOCIP Director. He provided the overview of the conference, its objectives, the conference's history and past achievements. Included in the presentation was a brief discussion of the UNSDGs to remind the participants of the global goals and the community's responsibilities in fulfilling those goals.

After, a short video presentation was shown which chronicles the different projects implemented by the University to the different partner communities. The slides were posters of the activities conducted from January 2021 to the present.

Then, the SOCIP Director discussed the summary of the proposed community projects for the year 2022. The projects were classified according to the UN SDGs that the project is focusing on. In the presentation, he highlighted that the community projects presented are just some of the commonly requested projects from the different barangays. (see attachment for the Proposed Community Projects according to UN SGDs) He also elaborated the procedures in processing the project proposals. Communities were highly encouraged to coordinate their proposals.

For the Question and Answer Portion, there were only two (2) questions that were raised. These were the following:

Question 1: May possibility po bang ma-grant yung proposal kahit non-depressed barangay po? (Is there a possibility that the proposal can be granted even if the community

is not depressed?)

Answer: Yes. Since there is already a partnership, the community and the University can

have a dialogue about the community's needs and the projects they can

collaborate on.

Question 2: We would like to ask po if sa 2022 ay magka-face-to-face interaction po tayo para pag-usapan ang mga proposed project na sinabi niyo po? Salamat po. (We would like to ask if there will be a face-to-face interaction in 2022 to talk about

the proposed projects cited earlier? Thank you.)

Answer: The SOCIP Office has already started to gradually visit the community for

coordination and discussion. Let us see, with the loosening of the restriction, if

the Office can visit the community.

To end the conference, the host barangay led the ceremonial activities with the Lighting of the Christmas Tree, the Pledge of Commitment, the Transfer of the Symbolic Key to the Next Host Barangay and the closing remarks from the Next Host Barangay Chairman, Ramonito Tuliao.








Engr. Joyrence Mervin Q. Agas discussing the procedure in processing the project proposals from the community.




