



Solar Powered Lamps for the Community

Mapúa University donated and installed 16 units of Solar Powered Lamps in Barangay San Andres and Barangay Sto. Niño, Tanay, Rizal last June 22, 2021 as part of its initiative to promote affordable energy.

The solar powered lamps were installed along the roadside and riverside to give illumination to the community at night. According to the Barangay Officials, the newly installed lamps would also help them in safeguarding the community and in monitoring the water level of the river especially during typhoons.

A Memorandum of Agreement and Pledge of Commitment were both signed by the Barangays and Mapúa University to signify and strengthen its commitment in improving the lives of the people in the community.

Installation of Solar Charger at Pandacan Communities

Mapúa University donated and installed 3 units of Solar Powered Chargers in Barangay 860, 871 and 872, Pandacan, Manila last October 14, 19 and November 26, 2021, as part of its initiative to promote affordable and clean energy.

The solar powered chargers were installed at the community's respective barangay halls. The project implemented by Mapua University in the barangays addressed the concerns on electricity consumption cost, according to the Barangay officials.

This also provides free charging facility for students to charge their gadgets to aid them in doing their online classes.
